As we come to the end of the first year of the 2018-2020 biennium, I am asking all chapters to please review membership statistics. Celebrate your successes! Celebrate your new and reinstated members! Were there any losses? We send our sympathies for any Omega sisters. Although their loss is very sad, please take inspiration from their achievements. Did any members resign or were dropped due to non-payment of dues? Please reach out to them and find out why this happened. Also, let them know that the door of membership is always opened to them.

Our International numbers are heartbreaking. These numbers were sent out on May 1st of 2019. 708 new members, 228 reinstated members, 1445 Resignations/ dropped due to non-payment of dues, 353 Omegas for a net loss of 862. 5 ENTIRE CHAPTERS were lapsed due to non-payment of dues. The total of lapsed chapters stands at 30. Ladies, we are down to 27,761 members. Please let these numbers sink in – something must be done. Why are we seeing so many members give up their membership in Alpha Delta Kappa?

I am sending out a SOC signal. Save Our Chapters, Save Our Chapters, Save Our Chapters! When the Titanic was sinking there was no need to find out why passengers were jumping ship! If the RMS Carpathia had come along side and sent 5,000 new passengers to board the Titanic, they too would have had to jump ship to save themselves. So what am I getting to... we have to find out why so many sisters are choosing to "jump ship" from the SS Alpha Delta Kappa. If our chapters have had any sisters to resign or were removed from the membership rolls because they did not pay their dues, we need to know why. Have the person in the chapter that feels the closest to this sister to make a call and inquire why they left. We need the data to better understand what is happening.

In a future column I would like to interview a chapter President who has an excellent retention rate of membership and share their secret for keeping their membership roster ship-shape. I want to share their secret to success with everyone! Please contact me so that we can turn the tide for Alpha Delta Kappa.






Composing our AZ Chapter Banner Parade! The Meaning Behind Those Priceless Banners!






Arizona Delta Chapter Central District

The saguaros represent the wonderful state of Arizona.


The violets on the pathway are the beautiful flowers of $A\Delta K$.
