From the Composer's Desk Ten Ways Music Helps Us....

It's amazing that listening to one particular song can elicit past memories of good or bad times. Music relaxes or *pumps* us up. More studies are needed to confirm the health benefits of music. Studies suggest listening to music can have positive effects. Let's investigate 10 ways music helps us:

Improves mood. Studies show that listening to music can benefit overall well-being, help regulate emotions, and create happiness and relaxation. **Reduces stress.** Listening to 'relaxing' music helps reduce stress and anxiety and in those undergoing medical procedures (e.g., surgery, dental, colonoscopy).

Lessens anxiety. In studies of people with cancer, listening to music combined with good care reduced anxiety compared to those who received standard care only.

Improves exercise. Music can enhance aerobic exercise, boost mental and physical stimulation, and increase overall performance.

Improves memory. Research has shown rhythm and melody help our brains form patterns enhancing memory. Do you remember learning multiplication or grammar with music?

Eases pain. Patients recovering from surgery, who listened to music before, during, or after surgery had less pain compared to patients who did not listen to music as part of their care.

Provides comfort. Music therapy helps enhance communication, coping, and emotions, like fear, loneliness, and anger.

Improves cognition. Listening to music can help people with Alzheimer's recall lost memories and even help maintain some mental abilities.

Helps children with autism. Studies of children with autism who received music therapy showed improvement in social responses, communication, and attention skills.

Soothes premature babies. Music and lullabies helped improve feeding behaviors of premature infants.

Confuses wrote: "Music produces a kind of pleasure which human nature cannot do without." So Arizona Alpha Delta Kappa sisters - keep the music playing!

GUIDING DOCUMENTS

Seeking Approval for AZ State Board Recommendation

A Policies and Procedures recommendation put forth by AZ Alpha Delta Kappa State Board will be voted on by all members attending the May 1-3, 2020 AZ State Convention.

The recommendation allows AZ State Alpha Delta Kappa to use its <u>Policies and Procedures Manual</u> as its guiding document, an option allowed under the International Bylaws which requires a vote at the Arizona State Convention. An approving vote would allow AZ State Alpha Delta Kappa to suspend the current AZ Bylaws in favor of using AZ Policies and Procedures Manual, along with International Bylaws, as the state's guiding documents.

Rational:

- Currently 16/23 AZ chapters have now suspended bylaws and are using an Official Policy Statement as
 the first page of their Policies & Procedures Manual.
- State Bylaws are redundant since they mirror the International Bylaws.
- Suspending AZ Bylaws reduces the need for guiding document updates to only one document; the Arizona State Policies and Procedures Manual.
- The required International even-year process of certifying AZ State Policies and Procedures Manual reduces paperwork to one page.
- Anything now stated in AZ State Bylaws that is specific to Arizona can be included in the current AZ
 Policies and Procedures Manual. (Such as: information on additional officer duties, additional
 committees, state districts, choosing convention delegates, and amending AZ Policies and Procedures
 Manual).


