

Empower chapters and individual members in positive membership growth through recruitment, reinstatement and retention of members.


Support each member to instill confidence in holding leadership positions at the chapter, state, regional and international levels.





Reminders and Updates from International



- ⇒ **CNA** - Chapters are encouraged to reflect with your members about the CNA goals set for the biennium and to check-in on these goals before the end of your chapter year. Are there goals that need to be tweaked or focused on next year? Has the chapter already met a goal? What can you celebrate that the chapter has done so far? This fall S/P/N (State/Provincial/National) leaders will have conversations with chapters around their goals to see how they are progressing and what support or resources might be needed.
- ⇒ **H-114** - The H-114 Annual Chapter Highlights Summary is due by **June 30** each year. This form is to provide chapter accountability and to comply with the Bylaws and IRS requirements. A sample can be found on the [International website](#) > Resource Library > Chapter Officers > Chapter Documents & Forms. An S/P/N officer and the Regional President-Elect will support chapters with this process.
- ⇒ **DPR** (Distinguished Program Recognition) - this is an optional submission of one of your chapter programs from June 1, 2024 through May 31, 2025. The purpose of this recognition is to acknowledge outstanding programs that are unique, creative and/or innovative. The list of previous submissions can be found in the Resource Library under the Chapter Officers tab. The program lists are a great resource for getting ideas for new programs next year. The application guidelines and score sheet can be accessed under the Membership tab > Awards > Distinguished Program Recognition box. The submission window will open **June 15** and close **August 15**.



T.R.O.T -Nothing Compares to the Therapy a Horse Can Give

AZ Psi chapter toured the 18 acre **Therapeutic Riding Of Tucson (TROT)** where adults, veterans and children with emotional and physical needs have an unique opportunity. According to TROT's brochures, since 1974, its vision is “Unlocking human potential through equine partnerships... empowering people with diverse abilities to reach their full potential through equine-assisted services.” TROT's programs focus on emotional, physical needs or a combination of both. Members heard about non-speakers finding ways to communicate, mobility challenged individuals finding freedom of movement and trauma survivors finding healing. With many Psi members having worked with disabled children, the TROT experience was powerful.

Members were busy in April making items to sell at October Founder's Day.


In May we will finish up the projects and finish our planning sessions for next year. Let's do something different—skydiving anyone!




From President Helen:
