From the Composer's Desk "Conductors and Alpha Delta Kappa!"

We've learned about the importance of music and the benefits music provides, but what about the individuals who lead the music groups? What is the purpose of a conductor? A conductor leads the different music groups with various styles and passion.

A few famous conductors include: Victor Borge, Johann Sebastian Bach, Jane Glover, Richard Strauss and Leonard Bernstein. As a former band and choir member, I always watched and followed my conductor, winning various awards. Have you ever wondered whether music conductors actually influence their orchestras? How does a conductor relate to Alpha Delta Kappa?

The University of Maryland completed a research study to determine if conductors were necessary, even for professional orchestras or groups. The study found "... the more the influence of the conductor to the players, the more aesthetic — aesthetically pleasing the music was overall." Therefore, conductors are essential to the performance of the groups.

Think about the Alpha Delta Kappa Chapters around the world and especially our Arizona Chapters. Whom do you look towards for your guidance or help? If you answered, your chapter president, you are correct. Our chapter presidents lead the chapters by running meetings, requesting help with altruistic projects, submitting reports and being current with information. However, the conductors are never alone, as the state leaders provide training and support. Please remember to help your chapter president whenever asked or maybe volunteer without asking! The DigDeep Navajo Water Project

The Navajo Water Project is a program of the <u>DIGDEEP</u> Right to Water Project, a nonprofit that plans locally-led water projects that brings clean, running water to American communities in need. The Navajo Water Project seeks to further this mission through the installation of cistern-based Home Water Systems for those 40% of the Navajo people without running hot or cold water or working toilets. You might have seen a special on CBS Sunday Morning News spotlighting the Navajo Water Lady, Darlene Arviso, who travels throughout New Mexico, Arizona and Utah, delivering water to hundreds of families monthly. New Mexico State AΔK President Renee Seelback has traveled and helped Arviso. She noticed at Christmas, some families only had potatoes for their main dinner.

Seelbach asked Arizona to help this winter and in the future to help make DigDeep Navajo Water Project an International World Understanding project. Anyone can be nominated - as long as they **are still active** in teaching and will be in 2020-2022, even if they've been nominated before.

The nominating colleague or chapter shall request the application form from the chapter president, state president, State EiE chair, the website or International Headquarters. The completed nomination forms must be mailed or emailed to the State EiE Chair by Nov. 1, 2019. Only applications received with a postmark dated by Nov. 1 will be accepted.

UPDATED 2019 MEMBERSHIP CAMPAIGN!

January 1 through April 30 marks our 2019 Membership Campaign. Your Chapter Presidents received a notice of this in their President's Packet in August. **Attached** is a copy of this updated document. The second paragraph explains the updated criteria for membership. This is the time when most chapters initiate new members. Encourage them to get all the **needed paperwork and fees** into Headquarters by **April 30** so that they are entered into the drawing for a registration fee to the International Convention in Minnesota.

In order for Alpha Delta Kappa to remain a vibrant organization, the challenge is to initiate new members or reinstate former members. Your enthusiasm for Alpha Delta Kappa will attract others who will want to join you in our organization!

The criteria for membership in Alpha Delta Kappa is that the prospective member be an outstanding educator, have a degree in education or be certified, be actively engaged in education and under contract in the field of education. Retired educators who are still interested in education are also eligible. Think of the outstanding women educators. Think of the outstanding women you know that would benefit from all Alpha Delta Kappa has to offer!

New/reinstated members must be initiated/reinstated and all current forms (under Documents and Forms on the website) and fees must be received at Headquarters by April 30, 2018 to be eligible for the membership drawing.

Forms required for new/reinstated members are:

- H-103 Membership Application and Badge form sent to International Headquarters prior to initiation.
- H-133 Report of Initiation sent to International Headquarters immediately following initiation.
- H-154 Petition for Reinstatement

NOTE: Members transferring into your chapter or new chapters do not qualify for the campaign.


What Your Chapter Could Win!

Arizona Gamma Phoenix




Arizona Alpha Lambda's Banner Lake Havasu City

Our Alpha Lambda banner highlights Lake Havasu City's historical London Bridge that crosses the man made canal through the peninsula jutting into Lake Havasu. The desert and river mountains surround our beautiful city.

Our chapter's name and charter date appear at the bottom.



Arizona Alpha Beta Window Rock



AZ Alpha Beta's banner was designed in 1988 by Thelma Claw (with the assistance of her husband, John Claw—designer of the official seal of the Navajo Nation. It features Alpha Beta's, "Rainbow Woman", a beaded handiwork creation handcrafted by 11 members taking several weeks to complete and serving to unite the sisters in love and commitment. A poem, by Dr. Virginia Bailey, "Arizona Alpha Beta" further celebrates the bond sisters feel for one another and impact of the banner.

The banner's story is symbolic for this chapter. Fraught with meaning specifically are the neck/ bodice area, the rainbow body of olive green, golden yellow, and violet purple, the sashbelt/skirt, the leggings/moccasins, the ear of Indian corn with its four sacred colors, and the four sacred mountains/Window Rock. The detailed symbolic meaning is available to anyone requesting it from chapter historian, Renee' Atcitty or chapter president Judy Kimbrough.

Arizona Omicron Chapter Tucson

Our Omicron Banner was updated in 2007-2008 at the suggestion of member Pat Trias who was serving as Arizona State President (2006-2008). Member Terry Shaw's friend Diane Kovell designed and quilted the banner to our specifications featuring the Mission San Xavier del Bac a symbol of Tucson and our Arizona-Sonoran Desert.

The doves in our banner represent the mission which is also know as the White Dove of the Desert. The Prickly Pear Cactus in front of the mission plays a special part in the restoration and maintenance of San Xavier. As historically constructed in 1783-1797 the Prickly Pear juice is used as a glue along with a mixture of lime and sand to plaster the exterior walls of the mission and its towers.

Our banner was completed in 2008 and was first displayed in Tucson at the Double Tree Hotel at the Arizona State Convention April 25-27, 2008.
